Introduction

This month the Acacia Fraternity Foundation celebrates its **33rd Anniversary**. Founded in 1989, the Acacia Fraternity Foundation makes it possible for Acacians and friends of Acacia to make tax-deductible contributions to support the educational activities of Acacia Fraternity and provide scholarships for undergraduates.

The Foundation received over \$1.1 million from 1,119 contributors during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. At year-end Foundation, assets were \$3.73 million. Over the last 33 years, 6,731 Donors representing 95 different Chapters and Colonies, and friends of Acacia have contributed over \$16.5 million dollars to the Foundation for these purposes.



The Foundation has established an account for every chapter and colony. Many chapters have established additional accounts for special purposes such as building funds and named scholarships. Please refer to the attached financial statement for a complete list of chapter accounts.

Chapter accounts can be used to support qualified educational activities, including:

- Cornerstones, Acacia's undergraduate member development program
- Chapter scholarships and membership recruitment scholarships
- Leadership and other member achievement awards
- Educational seminars, faculty speakers and community service projects
- Chapter library materials, including furniture and computers
- Internet and campus computer system connections, equipment, and monthly fees
- Study programs including rental of on-campus study rooms
- Renovation, maintenance, and operation of the qualified educational portion of chapter houses
- Expenses for attending the Acacia Leadership Academy and Officer Leadership Summit

The Foundation credits investment earnings to chapter accounts that maintain balances of \$1,000 or more.

Endowments



Foundation Fiscal Year Financial Report

The Foundation's summary financial statement for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, is attached at the end of this annual report.

Foundation Assets

The Foundation's assets are professionally managed by the Indianapolis office of UBS, the world's largest wealth manager. The UBS Indianapolis office specializes in managing investments for national fraternity and sorority foundations. The Foundation's Investment Committee monitors the work of our UBS asset managers. The Foundation has two investment funds at UBS, a conservative fund, and a managed fund. Either option may be selected for each chapter account or donorestablished endowment account.

The conservative option is designed to safeguard the principal balance of the account. It consists of FDIC insured savings and money market funds. Investment earnings are generally modest in line with short-term bond yields. This option is a prudent choice for accounts being used to fund a current project or commitment. Accounts with balances of \$1,000 or more in the UBS conservative fund were credited with earnings of **2.5%** over the fiscal year.


The Foundation's UBS conservative fund balance was **\$486,068** on June 30, 2022, and \$524,384 on June 30, 2021. The reduction in the UBS conservative fund for the fiscal year is wholly attributable to withdrawals for grants and chapter scholarships.

The managed option provides an opportunity for significantly higher investment earnings over time; however, this option may lose value during investment market downturns. This investment option uses a mix of fixed-income and equity investments and is a prudent choice for endowments and accounts where long-term growth is desired. Most chapter accounts, endowment accounts and the Foundation's General Fund are invested in the UBS managed fund.

For the first half of the fiscal year (July-December 2021) accounts with balances of \$1,000 or more in the UBS managed fund were credited with earnings of 4.4%. However, the economy and stock markets were not kind to investors during the second half of our fiscal year (January-June 2022) as the U.S. economy officially entered a bear market. The S&P 500 declined 20% and the Russell 3000 declined 21% during the first six months of 2022. This is the first fiscal year since the Great Recession of 2008 that the market value of our managed fund assets declined overall for the fiscal year.

The Foundation's UBS managed fund balance was \$2,833,710 on June 30, 2022, and \$3,890,239 on June 30, 2021. Withdrawals from the UBS managed fund for grant payments exceeded new deposits by \$447,220 for the fiscal year. After adjusting for these items, the net decline in the balance of the UBS managed fund was \$609,300, or - 15.66% for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022.

In addition to the two UBS accounts, the Foundation maintains checking and savings accounts for everyday operations at Chase Bank. Foundation assets on June 30, 2022, were \$3,473,700, a decrease of \$1,075,199 compared to June 30, 2021.



IRS Information and Compliance

The Foundation is a qualified tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Foundation's Federal Tax ID is 35-1778332. Contributions are tax-deductible to the full extent provided by law. The Foundation supports Fraternity's leadership training, educational endeavors and educational portions of fraternity house structures and scholarships to deserving student Acacians.

All Foundation expenditures, scholarship awards and educational grants are carefully reviewed and documented in compliance with IRS rulings and guidance to ensure the continued federal tax-deductibility of donations to the Foundation. The Foundation was established on August 18, 1989, under the laws of the State of Indiana.

Membership

The membership of the Foundation is comprised of all active, alumni and honorary members in good standing with Acacia Fraternity who contribute to the Foundation during the twelve months between Annual Meetings. At the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year the Foundation had 1,119 members.

Board of Directors

The members elect representatives at each Annual Meeting to the Foundation's Board of Directors, which oversees the affairs of the Foundation. The Board of Directors is presently composed of 25 voting directors and 7 non-voting emeritus directors representing 24 different Acacia chapters. The Foundation welcomes inquiries and suggestions from alumni, young and old, interested in serving on the board of directors.
